The entire team at Karate Alberta (KA) is pleased to bring you a one day tournament Provincial Championship. The tournament will be used for KA members vying for a position on the KA Provincial Team for Nationals 2019.

The Novice and Intermediate events will be opened up to the greater Karate community not currently registered with KA in hopes that they will consider joining KA in the future. Advance events are open only to KA Members.

There will be four tatamis operating and we are confident that with the help of our dedicated volunteers and officials the day will run smoothly and efficiently.

In order to ensure that our Sportdata team is not overrun with last minute requests there will be a FIRM registration deadline. There will be plenty of reminders before the deadline to ensure the process is reasonable and fair. We cannot accept late registrations and changes (without monetary penalty), exceptions will be only be made for medical reasons, Dr. note required.

As always, we will need volunteers to help marshal competitors, keep score and time the matches at the tables. Each dojo will be required to provide minimum 3 people for table work or officials.

WAIVER	Club Administrators - please ensure that all competitors have completed and signed the waiver by the <i>Competitor/Guardian and Witness</i> , found below in the Registration Forms. Please <u>bring these forms</u> with you to the Registration Table when you make payment. We do not have extra waivers at the tournament so please print off your own for completion. We cannot accept emailed documents, as original signatures are required.
TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE	Tournament will start with the youngest athletes and finish with the adults in the afternoon. Kumite event will follow immediately after kata event for all youth divisions as much as possible.

VOLUNTEER LINK	Volunteer Sign Up Saturday 7:45am set-up, AND end of day take down - all team prospects – remember to sign in with the Tournament director. Marshals * Time keepers * Score keepers * Registration * Food Room Each dojo must provide minimum 3 volunteers for table work or officials. Team Prospects – If you are planning to be partially funded as a member of the KA Provincial Team you (your family) will need to volunteer at KA events which will include assisting at KA Tournaments, KA Committees, Board of Directors.

Registration Information

- Payment options: ONE cheque or One e-transfer from each dojo

Through your respective bank online banking set up 'Karate Alberta' as an interac payee; using the email address treasurer@karateab.org. Each respective bank will have its own secure approval process in setting up an e-transfer interac payee. Once set-up all you need to do is select 'Karate Alberta' as the payee and input the payment amount to be transferred from your bank account. There is no security question or password required! IMPORTANT - there will be a small 'message' option for your e-transfer - generally 40-characters in length. Please write Fall Tournament 2019 – (name of your dojo).

- Receipts will be handed out following tournament
- a. *Athletes aged 18, 19 and 20 years old may compete in individual U21 as well as Senior individual and Senior team divisions.*
- b. *Advanced Divisions Only – 2020 KC Nationals and Jr & Sr Pan American date matrix:*

Youth	12 as of May 1, 2020
Cadet, Junior & U21	14, 16, 18 as of August 24, 2020
Senior Kumite	18 as of Mar 20, 2020
Senior Kata	16 as of Mar 20, 2020

- c. *Participants in all Advanced Divisions must be aware that unless they are of age to compete in the said category at the 2019-2020 season's key international events (on the dates of these events, such as the 2020 Cadet & Junior Pan American Karate Championships, the 2020 Senior Pan American Karate Championships, etc.), they may NOT represent Canada (in the said divisions) at these competitions.*
- d. Please ensure you are in the correct division prior to the tournament. Participation and results will not be considered if you compete in the wrong division.

- e. Any questions regarding the provincial team can be directed to the Head Coach.

- Divisions are shown on bottom of pages 7 and 8. **Consolidation or Separation of divisions will occur at the discretion of the tournament organizers. Please check Sportdata - day before the tournament.**

- In the event a competitor must withdraw after the registration deadline an email must be sent to the Tournament Director, Rob Montgomery, (manager@calgarywadokai.com) at least 48 hours prior to the tournament date.

- **Refunds:** will only be given for medical reasons OR when the consolidation of divisions results in the cancellation of a match for the competitor. Refunds are given in the form of a credit to the dojo to be used towards the next tournament. We do not give individual refunds.
- The tournament will be run following the rules established by the WKF with modifications allowed by Karate Alberta.

Ring-side Coaches

- Pre-registration on SportData is **MANDATORY** for all Coaches
- Coaches shall be in appropriate coaching attire – track suit and closed toe shoes
- Coaches should be trained in Comp Intro
- Coaches cannot interfere with the match



Flag Event 4-6 year old combined

- Kata – athletes will be paired and present their kata simultaneously - Hantei for best kata
- Kumite - Each participant with two flags, one flag on either side of belt (left/right): blue & red competitors
- Participant who captures both of their opponent’s flags is declared the winner or the most flags after 1.5 minute run time, if tied - Hantei
- 2 matches for everyone: no single winner in Kata or Kumite, everyone receives One Medal
